comes in many forms



any form of physical force used against the victim that injures or endangers them



Stalking

a pattern of threatening or harassing tactics that causes an individual to fear for their health, safety, or wellbeing

Coercive Control

isolating a partner from family and friends, restricting access to resources



Emotional

Silence is violence. Talk about it.

chips away at self-worth and independence, leaving a victim feeling there is no way out of the relationship

Sexual

forced to participate in unwanted, unsafe and degrading sex



Economic

includes withholding money, withdrawing basic necessities or preventing someone from going to work

IWS SUPPORTS



IWS has never stopped working to address Gender-Based Violence (GBV) against Métis women, girls, and 2SLGBTQQIA+ individuals. As part of the "Human Trafficking and Family Violence Prevention Program," IWS, in partnership with the MMF, the Ma-Mow-We-Tak Friendship Centre (Thompson), and the Joy Smith Foundation, have created preventive, supportive, and accessible resources to be distributed in our Métis communities.

IWS is working towards "Shockproofing Communities", through this project funded by the Canadian Women's Foundation. With the 'Against GBV Consultations', Métis women's voices are being heard, to bring awareness to and combat GBV, building stronger and safer Métis communities across the Red River Métis Homeland.

Increasing IWS Capacity to Address Gender-Based Violence (GBV)

Funded by WAGE, the objective is to increase the capacity of the IWS to address Gender-Based Violence (GBV) issues more effectively in the Red River Métis community. By developing GBA+ research and analysis, IWS will better develop its program and services to prevent and address GBV for our members, tackling systemic barriers through an improved GBA+ capacity. This project also increases the capacity of IWS to develop more inclusive policy options and provide recommendations to all policy stakeholders, making a differential impact for Red River Métis women, girls, and 2SLGBTQQIA+ individuals.

GBV/Shockproofing Communities

Through this project funded by the Canadian Women's Foundation, IWS advocates and facilitates effective means of addressing multiple issues related to violence and provides opportunities for Red River Métis women, 2SLGBTQQIA+ individuals, and their families to help develop traditional healing practices, policies, and programs.

With the recent success of our GBV workshops in November, preliminary survey results indicate that IWS members would like more information, workshops, and supports surrounding GBV. IWS will continue to address GBV as the crisis continues, bringing awareness to the ongoing issues and providing safe, inclusive spaces where Métis women, girls, and 2SLGBTQQIA+ individuals can share their stories, building stronger and safer communities across the Red River Métis Homeland.

Against Relationship & Family Violence- Moving Towards a Healthier Metis Community

The aim of this project is to promote awareness of relationship and family violence for IWS members, reduce the risk of vulnerability to violence, increasing wrap-around services and resource supports for victims of family and relationship violence, and provide forums for discussions in the Red River Métis community.

IWS will increase prevention capacity, empower IWS members and their families, and build stronger, healthier communities. This project will reduce the incidences of relationship and family violence for Red River Métis girls, women and 2SLGBTQQIA+ individuals, thereby creating new violence-free generations and helping to break the "norm" of previous generations.

IWS SUPPORTS

IWS is also bringing awareness and understanding of sexual exploitation and human trafficking to Red River Métis women, girls, and 2SLGBTQQIA+ individuals. With a particular focus on IWS youth, bringing knowledge of these issues in a creative way that engages them will help IWS youth recognize predatory tactics and give them alternative resources rather than getting involved in negative lifestyle choices. Furthermore, as part of the "Human Trafficking and Family Violence Prevention Program," IWS, in partnership with the MMF, the Ma-Mow-We-Tak Friendship Centre (Thompson), and the Joy Smith Foundation, created preventive, supportive, and accessible resources to be distributed in our Red River Métis communities.

Pey Key Way Ta Hin - Bring Me Home

IWS was a part of the development of the National Action Plan in response to the National Inquiry on Missing and Murdered Indigenous Women and Girls (MMIWG) and continues to be a part of the national MMIWG2S+ Advisory Committee.

IWS is a strong advocate for 'Every Child Matters'. Our children are the future of the Red River Métis, and this philosophy is behind the development of IWS's new program in collaboration with the MMF - "Pey Key Way Ta Hin/Bring Me Home." A Family Support Worker hired to work within Métis communities with MMIWG2S+ survivors, and family members will give them a voice. Along with advertisements to 'bring the lost home,' the MMF will assist with rewards for any information. Our goal is to bring our lost ones home, returning them to their families

Métis Culture and Identity Revitalization

IWS is engaging Métis girls and women through a variety of fun Métis-specific cultural revitalization workshop series and social media outreach. These workshops will educate youth about their own Métis culture, heritage, and traditions, promoting Métis identity through sharing and teaching.

IWS recognizes and acknowledges Métis women's requests and the need for increased understanding of Red River Métis culture, traditions, and their identity as Métis. The activities IWS provides help build Métis girls and young women's confidence, leadership skills, and increases youth involvement in our Homeland.

Employment Strategy for Red River Métis Women, Girls, and 2SLGBTQQIA+ Youth

IWS is equipping Métis women with the tools they need to find meaningful employment. IWS is the central access point for Métis women, girls, and 2SLGBTQQIA+ youth in school to apply for jobs, connect with employers across Manitoba, and for employers to apply for Métis students.

IWS and MET work together to pair bright young Métis women with promising positions every summer with the IWS 'Summer Student Employment Program.' Fully funded by MET, Métis students gain employment, training, and mentoring by employers in their Region. Employers gain a fully-funded student.

The Internship Program for post-secondary students to work within IWS, the MMF and its Affiliates during the school year is creating sustainable future staff.

IWS SUPPORTS

Métis Early Learning & Child Care

We are committed to the well-being of children and their families. Therefore, IWS, in partnership with the MMF - Early Learning and Child Care (ELCC) Department, is creating a Métis ELCC Strategy that will improve ELCC for Métis women, their children and their families.

The "Manitoba Métis Women-Centred ELCC Quality Improvement Project" will outline a Métis Women-centered governance model that supports Métis-led ELCC decision making and defines a high-quality and inclusive Métis childcare model. It will build and improve partnerships with MMF communities across Manitoba to develop culturally appropriate home-based child care initiatives and provide leadership and management training to Métis women working in the Métis ELCC field.

IWS will support the provision of quality, licensed, play-based, Métis-specific ELCC programs for children (12 weeks to 12 years of age) through Licensed Child Care Centres. IWS is creating, renovating, and building "Little Infinity Child Care Centres" across Manitoba.

Métis Employment & Training Department (MET)

The MMF's Métis Employment & Training Department (MET) operates through funds provided by the Indigenous Skills and Employment Training (ISET) Agreement with Canada. The Indigenous Skills and Employment Training Program (which replaces the Aboriginal Skills Employment and Training Strategy) links employment and training programming to current and future labour market demands and ensures that Canada's Indigenous people can fully participate in employment and economic opportunities. The MMF ISET Agreement with Canada was signed on May 15, 2019, at MMF Home Office in Winnipeg. This 10-year agreement, beginning April 1, 2019, provides enhanced funding and increased flexibility to create and deliver Métis-specific employment and training programs and services.

Mental Health Support Line

The MMF is prioritizing the mental health of its citizens. The need for Métis specific mental health supports is evident now more than ever in the wake of the COVID-19 pandemic. One current mental health support is a telephone line that provides citizens access to Metis counsellors and resources. Watch for updates on upcoming plans to expand our mental health supports.

Prescription Drug Program

The Prescription Drug Program, launched in 2017, will pay eligible Citizens' MMF calculated deductible throughout the year for Pharmacare-eligible prescription drugs.

Métis citizens aged 55 and older with an annual income of \$25,000 or less, who use MEDOCare Pharmacy for prescription dispensing and delivery are eligible for the Prescription Drug Program.

AFFORDABLE HOUSING

The MMF is committed to building and maintaining affordable housing units for Metis Citizens. To date, a total of 39 units have been built and 18 more are currently being built for a total of 57 units. Over the past year the MMF has completed the Frank Bruce Métis Seniors Complex in St. Laurent, and construction has commenced on future affordable housing builds that consist of triplexes, duplexes, and more seniors housing in Historic St. Boniface in Winnipeg, Portage La Prairie, and Selkirk. The Housing Department is currently planning for future builds in communities across Manitoba to meet the housing needs of Métis families and Citizens.

Home Enhancement Loan Program (HELP)

The Manitoba Metis Federation (MMF) will provide a one-time forgivable loan of up to \$18,000 in Southern MB and \$25,000 north of the 53rd parallel (including taxes) to provide for emergency home repairs and renovations to improve, adapt, and maintain existing housing stock. The amount was recently increased from \$15,000 to \$18,000 to respond to an increase in construction costs.

In this program, safety and well-being is a priority, and preference will be given to Metis Citizens who demonstrate emergency or health and safety-related housing needs.

As HELP is designed for low to moderate income Metis Citizens, applicants must have a total gross annual household income not exceeding \$90,000. The applicant household's total liquid assets inclusive of RRSP investments must also not exceed \$300,000. The MMF will consider special circumstances for some applicants who do not meet these criteria.

Due to the overwhelming demand for the program, applicants may experience delays for their repairs. Our team is working as fast as possible and we want to ensure applicants that your Metis government is working hard on your behalf. We are still accepting applications.

Eligible expenditures can include:

- Emergency home repairs
- Home repairs and renovations
- · Upgrades for accessibility
- Senior's upgrades for accessibility
- Adapt unit to suit household composition
- Electrical, sewer and water infrastructure, water and sewer testing

Ineligible expenditures include but are not limited to:

- · Purchase of land or outbuildings, land transfer costs
- Administration, salaries or wage costs, legal costs
- · Purchase of mobile trailers for renovation and repair
- Purchase of housing units to renovate and repair and sell
- Costs associated with the development of drawings and/or blueprints
- Costs associated with legal fees, consultation or permits

Justice Support Program (JSP)

The Justice Support Program (JSP) was developed by the Manitoba Métis Federation to focus on the delivery of an efficient and effective reintegration process for Métis people.

The goal of the JSP is to assist men and women in conflict with the justice system to reintegrate into the community. The program services Métis community members that have been remanded, have been released from provincial or federal correctional facilities or have received community dispositions.

The JSP assists individuals to identify and access resources to overcome barriers and address basic needs such as income, clothing, housing, health, family, etc. The program focuses on enhancing individual life skills to support individuals to become employment or education ready.

Métis Citizens who would like to seek support through the program can participate through the onsite Correctional Career Fairs offered within Manitoba Correctional Centres to speak with staff in person or contact our office by telephone.

SAFETY PLANNING

Can you identify signs that your partner is escalating, such as body language, or anything he says prior to becoming violent?

What sorts of things do you do when you are being abused? Where do you go?

How easy is it for you to leave the house?

Are there areas in your home that are safer than others?

When the perpetrator is abusing you, what areas of your body are most important to protect?

Is there a safe place in the community you can go to if necessary?

Is there something you can do or say to your children, so they know to get to a safe place?

Is there something you can do or say to someone that you trust to let them know you need help?

Who can be a part of your safety plan so that they can get help for you?

What role can professionals play in safety planning?

Can you keep some extra money somewhere for emergencies?

Do you think you will ever be interested in involving the police?

POWER AND CONTROL WHEEL













The Power and Control Wheel is a heuristic tool that focuses on how eight different types of abuser tactics partner with physical and sexual violence (or the threat of physical and sexual violence) to dominate a victim. The wheel is made up of these component parts:

Physical and Sexual Violence (outer ring)
Using Intimidation
Using Emotional Abuse
Using Isolation
Minimizing, Denying and Blaming
Using Children
Using Male Privilege
Using Economic Abuse
Using Coercion and Threats
